

KALAELOA TRAFFIC CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Construction is underway at the future site of the VA (ALOHA) Clinic near the intersection of Kamokila Blvd. and Franklin D. Roosevelt (FDR) Ave. as work has begun on the building's foundation.

Nearby road construction work continues in the area. Crews completed majority of the new underground electrical system, and they have started work on the FDR Ave. roadway drainage system. Additional road closures may be required in the coming months as Hunt works to expand FDR Ave. from a 2-lane roadway to a 4-lane traffic pattern.

Hunt's construction team has safety top of mind and continues to work diligently with engineers and respective government agencies to develop a plan to safely construct the new FDR Ave. and Kamokila Blvd. intersection. Any changes to road closures or construction will be announced as it becomes available.

In December 2021, Hunt broke ground on the new Veterans Affairs (ALOHA) Clinic in partnership with the Veterans Affairs Pacific Island Health Care System (VAPIHCS). Hunt is also preparing infrastructure for new homes being built by Gentry Homes. This is part of Hunt's commitment to revitalize Kalaeloa and bring jobs and homes to the area for local residents.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we work to create the foundation for the future of Kalaeloa. Hunt's top priorities during this phase are to ensure safety and to create easily accessible alternate travel routes in the area. Hunt's construction team is working extensively with the contractor to minimize impacts on traffic.

FDR Ave: Changes from 2-lanes to 4-lanes along the entire length of the project with two lanes in each direction. This new segment will have sidewalks on both sides of the road, which will increase walkability in the area.

Boxer Rd: Because the two projects are being built where the existing road is, Boxer Road is being closed and relocated makai. The road will temporarily be a 2-lane road with a planter strip and sidewalk on the mauka side.

Copahee Ave: Adjacent to Barbers Point Elementary, Copahee will remain a 2-lane road with the planned addition of sidewalks/planter strips on both sides and space for parking. This makes it a much safer walking environment around the school.

Kamokila Blvd: Kamokila's 4-lane roadway extends into the Kalaeloa project. The Kamokila extension will also have two travel lanes going in both directions with bike lanes continuing on both sides of the roadway.

The goal is to complete these necessary improvements as efficiently as possible while providing safe access in and around Kalaeloa with minimal interruption.
